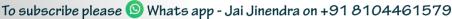


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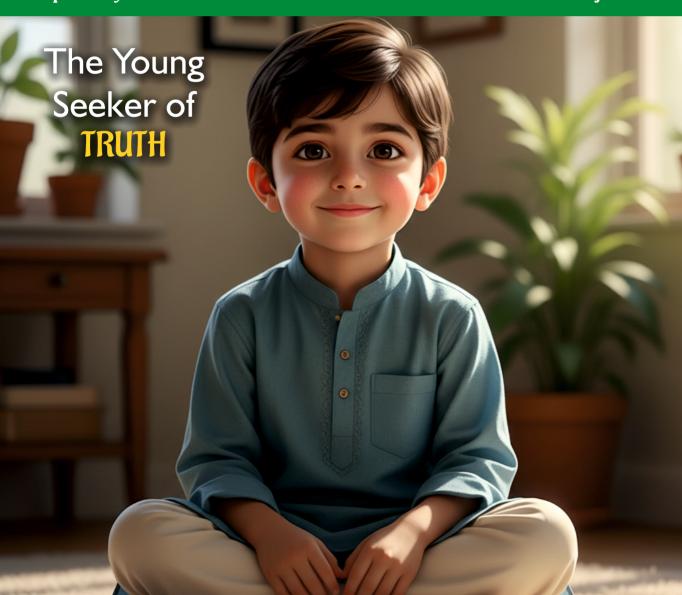

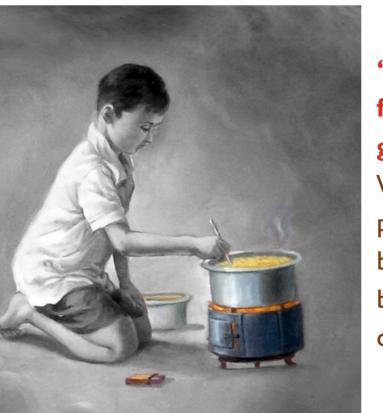
# THE PLUG SHOCK

# COMPASIONATE, LITTLE MAHAVIR

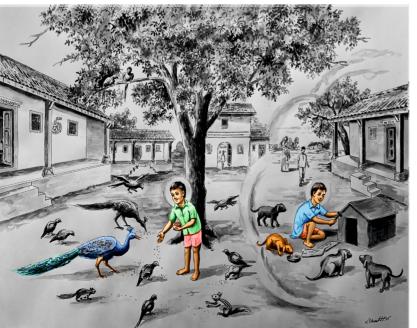
Kids, do you know how before diksha little Mahavir was?

In a small village in Saurashtra, in the courtyard of his house, little

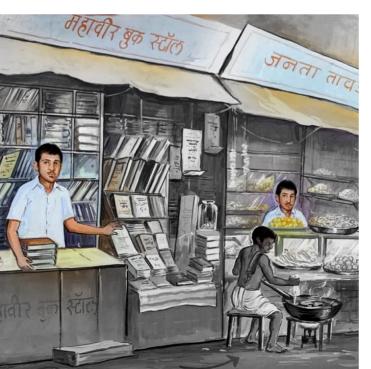

This touching story shows us how even as a child, Param Gurudev learned to face life's challenges with strength - and this journey of struggle later became the foundation of His greatness!



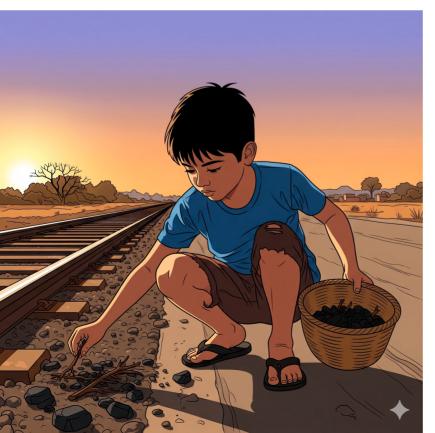
Children, do you know? Even little acts of help can make you grow big in responsibility!

Mahavir was very helpful to his mother. At that time, their situation was not easy. His mother had to cook on a sigdi (stove) using wood or coal as fuel. Every day, before meals, little Mahavir would collect small twigs from street or coals from railway tracks and bring them home so that his mother could cook.

His feeling was simple yet strong: "Why should my mother work alone for the food that I eat? As much as I can contribute, I will surely do. I don't want to depend on anyone. I want to live with the strength of my own hard work." This became his life's mantra.

## THE CLEVER MAHAVIR

When Mahavir was young, he often noticed the poor children around him. One day, he really liked a pant and wished to buy it because he wanted to wear it so much.

But whenever he expressed this desire, he also saw the children near him. They didn't even have proper pants - their half-pants were torn with 10–12 holes in them. Seeing this, Mahavir thought to himself:

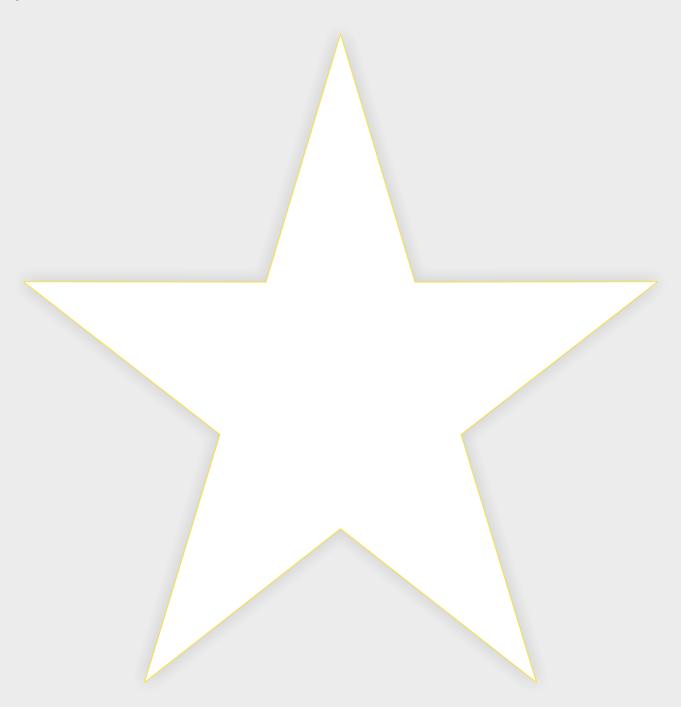

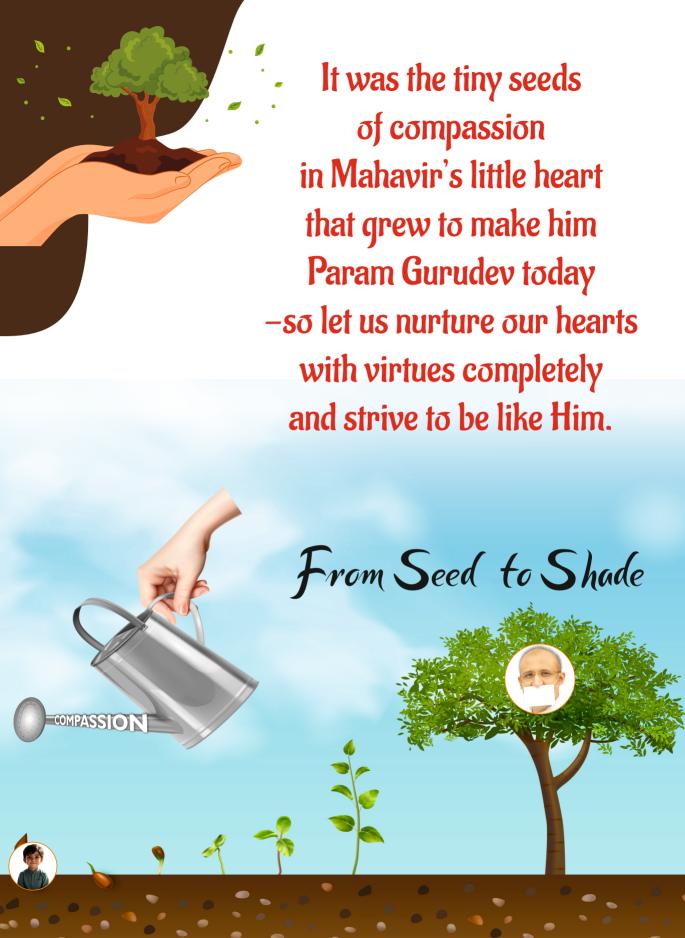


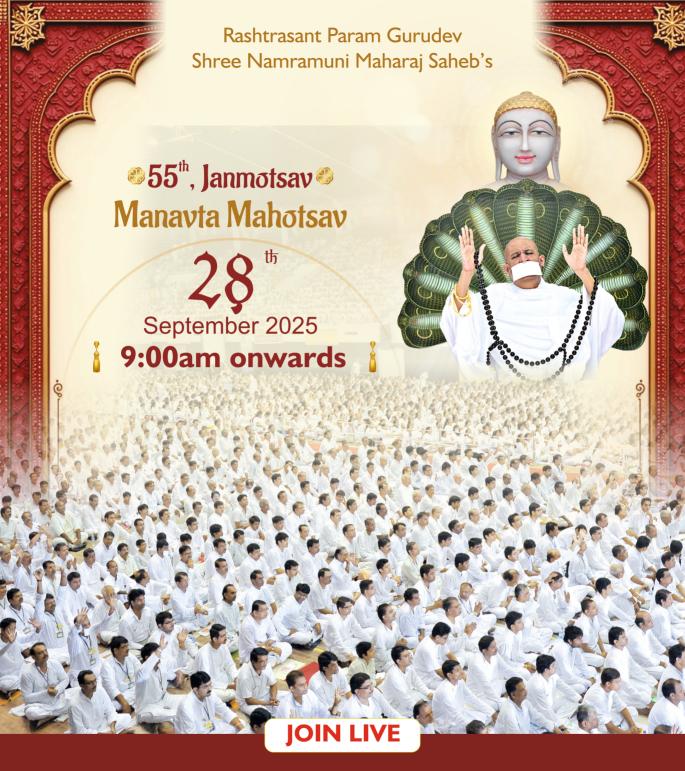
#### Arpan Your Tyag to Param Gurudev!
